



DNA RESIDENCY 2022

Information Guide & Agreement

June 1st - November 1st

General Information

Freight + Volume is pleased to present its eleventh annual season of the DNA artist-in-residence program. Like last season, we plan to give over 50-60 artists the time and space to create on the Cape in Provincetown, MA. They are invited to make new work inspired by their environment or continue their existing studio practice while a resident at the DNA studio. Residency sessions begin and end on Sundays and range from one to three weeks in length (2 weeks being the recommended and preferred length) throughout the season. Transportation to the Residency from NYC

In addition to residents bringing or renting a car there are a number of options to reach the residency by public transportation. From Port Authority the Peter Pan bus service offers rides to Cape Cod
From Pennsylvania Station, take Amtrak to Boston South Station.
From Boston, the fastest way to get to Provincetown is the Fast Ferry.
There are several bus options between Boston and the Chamber of Commerce.
From South Station in Boston, you can take a bus to Hyannis Transportation Center, then from Hyannis to the Chamber of Commerce in Provincetown.

Studio and Housing

First stop on your trip is the DNA Studio. The address for the studio is 288 Bradford St, Provincetown, MA 02657, on the second floor of the Tennis Club. Bathroom is located on the first floor-- one set of keys for the studio are always stored in the lockbox (**code 1492**) on the side door on the left of the building.

Second stop is the cottage located at 65 Oak Road Eastham, MA 02642.

This year we have a brand new 2 bedroom/2 bathroom cottage (2 Queen Beds), with a washer/drier, WiFi and cable. Service or ESA animals are allowed. Please bring your own bedding and towels. We encourage artists to bring their own supplies. Art materials can be purchased at Artist Loft or Conwell Hardware and Lumber.

Check in for new arrivals is after 4pm on Sunday, and Check out is at noon on Sunday. Please make sure all sheets and towels from apartment, bathroom and kitchen are clean and ready for the next artist-in-residence, and that all dishes are cleaned. There's a public laundromat at 68 Shank Painter Road.

Parking availability at studio: There are parking spots in the driveway at the studio marked "DNA Gallery Only" which artists can share amongst themselves.

Trips to the studio, supermarket, post office and of course, the beach and seashore trails are essential and allowed during quarantine. Artists can Google Provincetown for further activities such as: hiking, biking, whale watching, fishing, beaches, national seashores, and restaurants. There are 4 bikes for artist use while at the residency. The combination lock code for the blue, purple, and silver bikes is **1492**. The combo lock on the red bike is **2693**. Please use the combination locks when bikes are parked, so neither the bikes nor locks are stolen :)

Artists are responsible for bike maintenance. Additionally, there should be plastic sheets available to use to protect the floors of the studio. Please feel free to use that, and finally for any works stored, you can use the flat file, but please ensure it is labeled with your name and any other information.

No overnight stays permitted in the studio space at any time. **No** smoking permitted inside or outside the apartment/studio.

Donation of Artwork

In order to confirm your dates we ask that you kindly send us 5-10 artwork .jpegs you would be willing to donate in exchange for your time at the residency along with a narrative bio and link to your website which we can add to our new website. Your donation will help defray the increasing overhead costs of running the residency and so we ask that your selection is within the range \$2000-\$4000, **per week, per artist**. Artwork will need to be selected and received 30 days prior to your arrival in Provincetown. Any changes must be approved by the Residency Director. Any cancellations within 30 days of your selected dates, apart from a dire medical situation will result in the gallery retaining your artwork trade/donation.

General Cleanup and Departure Instructions

Kindly leave a bottle of wine in the apartment/refrigerator for the next group of artists.

Feel free to leave a drawing and/or note in the communal journal. This journal will serve as a collective record for the 2020 residency season and will be kept in the front room of the studio. Any old food, trash and recycling should go in the Tennis Club trash containers on the ground floor below the balcony.

It is to be expected that the trash bins may be visited by raccoons and/or foxes. **Please** ensure that all bags are properly sealed, that the lids are secured tightly and the black handle is locking the lid in the upright position.

Trash and recycling gets picked up once a week on Sunday night. If we've run out of small trash bags, we ask that someone pick up a box from the deli down the street. Brushes should not be washed in the Tennis Club sink on the ground floor, instead please use a bucket. Please make sure studio floors are kept clean and free of paint, clean drop cloths are stored in the front room closet. Dirty drop cloths should be disposed of properly before you leave. Be sure to close all windows except for the drawstring window above the back doors-- those remain open all season.

If an artist needs help or advice regarding transporting their work from the residency to their studio please contact Nick and Marissa to coordinate shipping at the end of the season.
